講演概要

日戦後設立のCoE (Council of Europe:欧州評議会)やその理念を継承するEUの複言語複文化主義の言語教育政策と、EUと袂を分かったイギリス(イングランド)は何を得て何を失ったのか。そこから我々が学び取れるものは何かを考察し、我が国の異言語教育政策の行方を問う。第一発表者の杉谷がCoEとEUの言語教育政策とドイツについて、第二発表者の大場がイングランドの異言語教育について、Brexit以降の現状も交えて報告する。

Council of Europe (CoE) was established after the WWII, and it's philosophy of language education policy has been inherited inplurilingualism/pluriculturalism in CEFR and further in language education policy in EU. After Brexit, what did England gain and lose by withdrawing from EU? The lecturers cast questions about what we can learn from this and the future direction of Japan's foreign language education policy. The first lecturer will report on CoE and EU language education policy and the one in Germany, and the second lecturer will report on language education in England, including the current situation after Brexit

杉谷眞佐子:関西大学文学部ドイツ文学科の教員を経て、2013年まで同外国語学部、外国語教育学研究科でドイツを中心に、戦後ヨーロッパの外国語教育政策や教員養成に関する研究・教育に従事。現在は神戸日独協会でドイツ語・ドイツ文化に関する授業を担当。神戸日独協会理事、日本言語政策学会会員。

大場智美:私立中学高等学校、インターナショナルハイスクールで15年教員経験後、2016年より多摩大学グローバルスタディーズ学部でAcademic English Programと中学高等学校英語教職課程を担当している。2002年コロンビア大学修士号取得、2016年ロンドン大学大学院教育研究科博士課程満期退学相当。研究分野は日本と諸外国の外国語教育政策とその実践である。

About the lecturers:

Masako SUGITANI: She was a professor of German language and culture at Kansai University, Faculty of Literature, then worked at Faculty of Foreign Language Studies and Graduate School of Foreign Language Education and Research in the same university until 2013. Her research interests include language education policy, esp. in Germany as it is the country of historical awareness and a leading member of the EU. She is a board member of The Japan-German Society Kobe and teaching German language and culture. She is also a member of Japan Association for Language Policy.

Tomomi OHBA: She had been a secondary school teacher for 15 years, then became a teacher-trainer. Since 2016, she has worked as Academic English Program Coordinator and a teacher-trainer at School of Global Studies, Tama University. She received MA in TESOL from Teachers College, Columbia University in 2002, and passed Up-grading Session in Doctoral Course at Institute of Education, University College London in 2016. Her area of study is foreign language education policy and practice in Japan and in other countries.
