Applied Linguistics in Action: Developing an ELF-aware language center 実践的応用言語学：ELFを意識した語学センターの挑戦

This presentation traces the development of an ELF-aware university language program through an autoethnographic account grounded in the evolution of applied linguistics in Japan. It begins by outlining shifts from native-speaker norms and World Englishes toward English as a Lingua Franca (ELF), situating the Center for English as a Lingua Franca (CELF) at Tamagawa University within broader debates about the purpose and scope of applied linguistics. Because applied linguistics in Japan has long been tied to teacher accreditation and constrained by traditional linguistic expectations, innovation beyond native-speaker models has been limited. Against this backdrop, the presenter reflects on personal experiences as learner, teacher, researcher, and administrator to illustrate how native-speakerism shaped professional trajectories and underscored the need for a program aligned with applied linguistics' real-world, problem-solving mission.

The talk then outlines CELF's multi-phase establishment—curriculum design, assessment principles, teacher recruitment, and institutional negotiation—while addressing challenges such as student expectations for native-speaker instructors, faculty resistance, and administrative pressures. Strategies including eliminating “foreign instructor” categories and promoting shared governance helped counter these assumptions. CELF's diverse teaching staff, research initiatives, and growing institutional legitimacy demonstrate how applied linguistics can support sustainable, innovation-driven program development grounded in linguistic rights and critical awareness.

Masaki Oda, Ph.D. is the Immediate Past President of JACET. He is Professor of Applied Linguistics at Tamagawa University and Executive Director for Higher Education of Tamagawa University & Academy. His research interests include sociopolitical aspects of language teaching, media discourse and language program administration.
